Scholarship Description

Amount of Scholarship Award

\$1,000.00

Purpose and Application of Funds

This scholarship will financially assist a Muscogee (Creek) Nation student that might not have the financial means to further his/her education. This scholarship award can be utilized to pay for the required cost of tuition, fees, books, tools, supplies, testing or examination fees, transportation, or other incidental required cost related to the cost of the higher education, technical, or vocational technical school. This scholarship is to be awarded to a Muscogee (Creek) Nation student who has suffered the loss of a parent before turning the age of 18. This scholarship is to be awarded to a Muscogee (Creek) Nation student who is attending an institution of higher education or a technical/vocational trade school.

Eligibility Guidelines

1. Must be an enrolled citizen of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.
2. Must be currently attending an institution of higher education or enrolled as a first-time entering student.
3. Applicant must have suffered a loss of a parent before turning the age of 18.
4. Must demonstrate financial need.
5. Must agree to authorize the Scholarship Foundation Program to publicize the scholarship award if selected.
